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

The end of April and the beginning of May is a unique season for Jews- it is a time of semi mourning during the count of the Omer: 49 days between Passover and Shavuoth; but it also contains the modern celebrations of Israel's creation and Jerusalem's unification. You can read in this period the schizophrenic paradox of Jewish living: We suffer, we are in danger, and then we manage to survive, sometimes in miraculous ways. And with survival comes celebration. One might say that this is called life. Anyone alive will meet challenges, and most will survive them one way or another until their time is up. What may be extra- ordinary in our story is the length of our history, the depth of the lessons we gather from it- and the mission we feel we have to fulfill. We seem to be the carriers of a narrative of survival, a religion that prefers life over death and over self-sacrifice.

Whether we listen to our ancient stories such as Passover, Purim and Chanukah, or we celebrate the modern historical holidays of the nation of Israel- we find that our strength comes from conviction, search for truth, inner strength and faith.

As residents of this world, this message may ring universal and be applicable to any person or a nation who may be suffering. There is always hope- but you have to search for it, and fight for it- and act upon it with conviction and faith.

At this season, as at any other time- I wish all our friends and members to remember that any challenge we meet has a hopeful approach, a positive narrative and know that we are surrounded by people who seek to help.

May we continue to survive, personally and nationally, and enjoy peace and wholeness.
